Domaine de Bertier	2007	France	£16.15
<i>Domaine de Bertier is a single estate located near Montpellier in Southern France. The white is a blend of Viognier and Sauvignon Blanc, fresh and quite peachy in flavour.</i>			
Rioja Vega, Viña Cerreda Blanco	2006	Spain	£17.15
<i>100% Viura grapes are used in this classic white Rioja. With low acidity, high fruit and a clean finish this wine is good for cocktails or drinking on its own.</i>			
Monte Verde, Maipo Valley	2007	Chile	£18.15
<i>100% Chardonnay. Wine of pale yellow colour. Intense fruits, banana, pineapple aromas and delicious floral shades. In the mouth it is fruit-bearing with good acidity and a long finish.</i>			
White Wines			
Santa Celina	2006	Argentina	£18.70
<i>100% Pinot Gris from Mendoza, situated on a plateau in the foothills of the Andes and ranging in altitude from around 450 metres to 1200 metres above sea level. Pinot Gris grapes are grown at the higher altitudes as the temperature is cooler, consequently lengthening the ripening process.</i>			
Les Fumées Blanches, Lurton	2006	France	£19.20
<i>100% Sauvignon Blanc from the Languedoc-Roussillon of Southern France. The Lurton brothers (Jacques and François) have created this award winning vin de pays. Floral and delicate with a modern feel; a wine to take on the new world wine drinkers.</i>			
Domaine de la Cessane	2006	France	£19.70
<i>Marsanne/Viognier. Vin de Pays d'Oc. Two of Rhône's principle grape varieties that work perfectly in tandem. Ideal for accompanying light fish or meat without a rich sauce.</i>			
Domaine Langlois-Château, Saumer Blanc	2006	France	£19.70
<i>100% Chenin Blanc. A lifted fresh and approachable, fruity Saumur which offers the freshness of its chalky soil with the honeyed characters of the grape variety.</i>			
Berry's Pinot Grigio	2006	Italy	£20.15
<i>100% Pinot Grigio. Aged on the lees using top quality grapes from Italy's Colli-Orientali del Friuli region. Produced by Necotium. Ripe honeysuckle aromas and spicy white peach flavours, this generous, easy-drinking wine is equally delicious on its own or with food.</i>			
Chapoutier, Côtes-du-Rhône, Belleruche Blanc	2006	France	£20.20
<i>The 2006 Côtes du Rhône Belleruche blanc is a blend of Grenache Blanc, Bourboulenc, and Marsanne and shows honeysuckle, lemon oil, and white currants in a medium-bodied, crisp, attractive, surprisingly serious style.</i>			
William Fevre	2004	Chile	£21.15
<i>Don Victor (Wooded) Chardonnay Gran Reserva. Papaya and peaches are balanced by crisp citric flavours and subtle oak. Well married with a diverse range of dishes.</i>			
Escale	2006	France	£22.70
<i>100% Sauvignon Blanc. This is our top Sauvignon offering from the quality white wine region of Gascony. It is intensely fresh and aromatic with classic notes of gooseberries and cut grass. At only half the price of a bottle of Sancerre, this is a real bargain!</i>			
Gavi di Gavi	2007	Italy	£22.70
<i>Cru la Maddelena, Roberto Sarotto. 100% Cortese grapes from the southern Piedmontese hills. An excellent aperitif wine, un-oaked and with flavours of white stone fruit.</i>			
Domaine de Gerbeaux, Macon-Solutré,	2006	France	£26.20
<i>100% Chardonnay. A delicious Mâcon cuvée reserved entirely for Berry Bros. & Rudd. This has delightful, attractive soft fresh fruit with a mineral touch for drinking early.</i>			

Composite Vineyards, Ara, Marlborough	2006	New Zealand	£26.75
<i>100% Sauvignon Blanc. Composite Sauvignon is bright, stony, with pungent guava and gooseberry aromatics on the nose while the palate reflects the successful vintage, such as the broader, generous passion-fruit and stone-fruit flavours.</i>			
Speigal Heidler	2007	Austria	£27.25
<i>100% Grüner Veltliner. This Spiegel vineyard Grüner delivers a full, peppery palate and faintly apricot-scented wine that at 13% alcohol will cope with most summery white meat and fish.</i>			
Lagar de Cervera	2006	Spain	£27.25
<i>100% Albariño, Rias Baixas. Medium bodied, dry wine from the high-trained vines of the greener Western tip of Spain, the frighteningly modish Albariño grape. Aromatic, broadly textured and gently spicy, the Lagar is a famous example. To try with the fruits of the Atlantic.</i>			
Au Bon Climat	2006	California	£29.25
<i>100% Chardonnay. Also known as 'Wild boy Chardonnay' grown by the renowned wine producer Jim Clendenen. This is a succulent, fragrantly oaked example of appealing Californian Chardonnay.</i>			
Wiebelsberg	2005	France	£35.20
<i>100% Riesling. Domaine Lucas & Andre Rieffel use organic and bio-dynamic methods to create this wonderful Grand Cru. Grown on 50 year old vines on a rich mix of clay and mineral soil near the town of Andlau.</i>			
Domaine de Fourchaume, Chablis Premier Cru	2002	France	£35.20
<i>100% Chardonnay. A 17 hectare holding and one of the best placed premier crus in terms of soil, drainage and exposure. Again no cask ageing and more complex and youthful than the village Chablis.</i>			
Château de Puligny-Montrachet	2005	France	£37.20
<i>100% Chardonnay. Clos du Château. Château de Puligny was a slumbering force until finally been awoken by the arrival of Etienne de Montille in time to oversee the 2001 vintage. Under Etienne, yields have been drastically reduced and the wines are handled much more sympathetically in the cellar so that the quality of the fruit dominates the oak.</i>			
Rosé Wines			
Domaine Les Aphillanthes	2006	France	£18.15
<i>Côtes du Rhône Rosé. The domaine is located in the small town of Travaillan, just northwest of Gigondas. Here Daniel and Hélène have been fashioning Côtes du Rhône using biodynamic principals. Their red wine is also listed.</i>			
Château Gassier	2006	France	£18.70
<i>40% Syrah, 30% Grenache, 30% Cinsault. Selected from vineyards surrounding the most traditional of all rosé growing areas, Aix en Provence. Deliciously fruity, soft and very easy to drink, finishing crisp and refreshing.</i>			
Reverdy Sancerre Rosé	2005	France	£27.20
<i>Excellently matched to poultry this classic rosé has aromas of apricots and red currants; a refreshing yet full-bodied wine.</i>			

**Red Wines
House Selection**

Berry's House Red	2007	France	£16.15
<i>Merlot blend. The philosophy behind Berrys' Own Selection wines is simple. "We seek to work with leading producers to handcraft wines that are truly representative of both the wines region of origin and the winemaker's individual winemaking style. These are the wines on which our reputation rests, so you can be sure that we have left no stone unturned in unearthing the best value and quality possible in each region".</i>			
Rioja Vega, Viña Cerreda Tinto	2006	Spain	£17.15
<i>50% Tempranillo, 40% Grenache and 10% Mazuelo make this a bright garnet red wine with purple hues. Un-oaked and with notes of red berries; a good wine for drinking without food.</i>			
Monte Verde, Maipo Valley	2006	Chile	£18.15
<i>100% Cabernet Sauvignon. Located at El Monte, 50 kilometres west of Santiago with exposure to cooling Pacific breezes, this vineyard is blessed with a superb climate for viticulture. Monte Verde only produces wine from its own vineyard, with grapes hand-harvested after strict selection so that each bottle has a purity of fruit as well as considerable balance, harmony and structure.</i>			

Red Wines

Domaine de la Cessane	2005	France	£18.70
<i>Grenache and Merlot work well together here. Vinified separately, when assembled they yield a wine with ripe black fruit, spicyness and good length.</i>			
Ashbury Grove	2006	Australia	£19.20
<i>Cabernet Sauvignon / Shiraz. The Shiraz was harvested from selected vineyards in mid March at optimal fruit ripeness while the Cabernet Sauvignon was harvested in late March to early April to allow rich ripe fruit characters to develop. The parcels of grapes were kept separate throughout fermentation before being blended and oak matured. The aim was for a seamless integration of the Cabernet fruit structure and flavour intensity with the richness and warmth of Shiraz.</i>			
La Flor, Puenta, Mendoza	2006	Argentina	£19.70
<i>100% Malbec. Deep purple in colour with a nose of red berries, vanilla and chocolate, the wine is blessed with beautiful sweet fruit and a delicious and spicy backdrop. Rich and elegant, but with an almost ethereal quality, but sufficiently grounded to accompany a sirloin steak!</i>			
Man Vintners	2006	South Africa	£19.70
<i>Pinotage, with a dash of Shiraz and Viognier. Deep ruby red in the glass with a beguiling nose of strawberries and black cherries and a subtle hint of Pinotage's trademark smoky complexity. Juicy and fresh on the palate, this wine is extremely moreish.</i>			
Escale	2006	France	£20.70
<i>100% Pinot Noir. The very lightly oaked Escale Pinot Noir is elegant and fruity, displaying all the hallmarks of the Pinot grape with hints of raspberries on the nose and silky tannin structure on the palate.</i>			
Domaine Les Aphillanthes, Côtes du Rhône	2004	France	£21.15
<i>100% Syrah. The domaine is located in the small town of Travaillan, just northwest of Gigondas. Here Daniel and Helene have been fashioning Côtes du Rhône which have burst onto the international markets to considerable acclaim, with an effusive Parker describing the wines as "spectacularly powerful, concentrated...comparable to the finest Gigondas and Chateauneuf du Papes".</i>			
Wrattonbully, Smith and Hooper	2005	Australia	£23.70
<i>Cabernet Sauvignon / Merlot. The wine is sourced entirely from two premium, adjacent vineyard blocks in Wrattonbully, previously owned by the Smith and Hooper families. Wrattonbully is blessed with some of the most celebrated winegrowing soil Australia - Terra Rossa, aka 'red earth', a rich, free-draining soil. The 2004 Cab Sauvignon- Merlot offers intense aromas of violets and black currants, with vanilla overtones. The palate is rich with a velvety texture.</i>			
Domaine Alain Chatoux, Beaujolais	2007	France	£23.70
<i>100% Gamay. Villes Vignes. Another very fine effort from the big man, this displays lively raspberry fruit flavours, a pleasing spicy backdrop and a velvety finish. Try very lightly chilled, al fresco, with a summer salad or oysters.</i>			
Valpolicella, DOC, Ca'Fiu	2005	Italy	£24.70

100% Corvina with perfumed red cherry fruit that has seen just a short time in large French oak barrels. A benchmark, versatile north-Italian red from one of the region's leading producers.

Peachy Canyon 2005 USA **£25.20**
100% Zinfandel 'Incredible Red' from this 18 Hectare vineyard in the Paso Robles area nestled in Santa Lucia Mountains. The winery exemplifies the contrasts of a region which is ideally suited to growing Zinfandel. This wine is dominated by strawberry and raspberry aromas with a hint of black pepper - beautifully balanced.

La Montesa 2004 Spain **£25.75**
100% Tempranillo. Herencia Remondo Rioja Crianza. Cherry, mocha and coffee overtones with a core of ripe fruit lying underneath. Excellent wine for lamb or beef.

Crozes Hermitage 2004 France **£26.75**
Domaine des Remizieres, 100% Syrah. Philippe Desmure and his daughter Emilie look after their Domaine together in Mercurol. This vintage is deliciously evolved; rich and spicy aromas with plenty of fruit. Quite earthy in style, mirroring the aromas through the palate and showing evident structure.

Saint Emilion Grand Cru 2005 France **£27.75**
Château Rozier. This is a complete stunner: a compelling mouthful of concentrated Merlot supported by a little ripe Cabernet Sauvignon with layers of flavour and fine complexity. Soft and silky, the beautifully integrated tannins will ensure that this has years of life ahead. If, however, you can't resist it now we'd recommend decanting two hours in advance for complete enjoyment.

Waterford 2004 South Africa **£28.75**
100% Cabernet Sauvignon. The best vintage in Stellenbosch in the last 10-15 years. The Helderberg aromas tend to be a little earthy as opposed to fruity during the early stages of maturing in the bottle, and given sufficient time in the glass they expand considerably.

Ara, Composite Vineyards 2007 New Zealand **£29.25**
100% Pinot Noir. Composite wines are from Ara, a new origin of wine that lies at the confluence of the Wairau and Waihopai rivers in the world famous Marlborough region of New Zealand. Ara is an extensive and ancient river terrace – a remarkable feature on the New Zealand landscape presenting superb conditions for growing exceptional cool-climate Sauvignon Blanc and Pinot Noir. The wines, name and label designs are an integrated expression of the place - Ara - from soil classification, vineyard design, trellis construction and water networks to small batch winemaking and careful blending.

Chorey-Lès-Beaune 2005 France **£31.75**
Pièce Chapitre, Domaine Tollot-Beaut, 100% Pinot Noir. The Tollot-Beaut family domaine is based at Chorey-Les-Beaune, often thought of as a slightly old-fashioned backwater. Their vineyard holdings, however, extend to Beaune, Savigny, Aloxe-Corton and a tiny holding in the Corton Charlemagne vineyard. The hallmark of their wines is a striking purity of fruit - the reds display a truly succulent quality supported (but never dominated) by judicious use of oak.

Château Batailley 2001 France **£36.75**
Château Batailley Sieme Cru Paulliac has cassis, tobacco and vanilla-charged elements, with a subtle yet firm Paulliac backbone. An exceedingly approachable claret.

Gevrey Chambertin 2005 France **£41.20**
Camille Giroud, 100% Pinot Noir. This dry light-bodied red wine is a classic example of a red burgundy. The quality of winemaking is consistent and very much in the modern, quality-oriented genre, although the practice of very gentle oak treatment and little racking (decanting is advised for young wines) continues, so that each cuvée has a very individual character.

Dessert Wines

Berry Brothers and Rudd 2002 France **£19.75**
Sauternes, 2nd wine of Château Suduiraut (37.5cl). Wonderful sweetness but never cloying. Exotic apricots and almonds in perfect balance. Brilliant with creamy desserts, blue cheese and foie gras.

Joostenberg Noble Late Harvest 2005 South Africa **£22.75**
100% Chenin Blanc (37.5cl) from Paarl. A grape variety widely found in the Loire Valley producing stunning sweet wines and here is an example of the same variety in the new world. Rich in botrytis, the palate boasts pineapple, honeycomb and orange zest flavour. An absolute must with any fruit based dessert.

Vintage Port

Wines of this quality are made using the traditional treading techniques that have not changed in 2000 years, producing wines with intense colour and flavour. Selected from a number of top quality vineyards, including Warres own Quinta da Cavadinha, the company's Vintage Port is aged in wooden cask for 18 months before being bottled unfiltered using a normal driven cork.

Warre's Vintage

Given a 90 out of 100 by Robert Parker; this may prove to be a classic vintage. Drinks well now and will improve over the next few years.

Tremendous backbone with a rich complexity of balanced fruit showing through. This elegant Port has the characteristic Warre's flowery nose and its solidity shows it to be a lasting Vintage. Perfect for drinking now.

Champagnes

Ayala, Château de Ay £38.20
Brut Majeur is the result of the blending of a particular harvest with quality reserve wines. Ay being the capital of Pinot Noir, this noble grape is always dominant thus ensuring the vinosity, the fullness and the intensity of the wine. Chardonnay gives elegance, liveliness and finesse, and Pinot Meunier adds a delicate fresh and fruity note.

Ayala Blanc de blanc, Château de Ay £47.20
This vintage 100% Chardonnay champagne is a blend of three Grand Crus from the Côtes des Blancs in which Le Mesnil has the largest proportion, completed with wines from Cramant and Chouilly. These Crus combine beautifully to deliver a very elegant, light, creamy and lively wine.

Ayala Rose, Château de Ay £47.20
Rose Majeur is a unique blend where the importance is given to Chardonnay which accounts for more than 40% of the cuvée. The unusual proportion of white grapes and low dosage gives extra-ordinary delicacy to the wine.

Bollinger Special Cuvée NV £50.20
Bollinger contains a high percentage of Pinot Noir in the blend making it one of the richest non-vintage Champagnes.

Billecart Salmon Brut Réserve Rosé NV £55.25
Owned by the original family established in 1818 by Nicolas-François Billecart. Most of Billecart-Salmon's fruit comes from a small vineyard holding. Meticulous production techniques, from the use of their own cultured yeast to its long, slow, cool fermentation, ensure that the family has 100% control of production.

Veuve Clicquot, La Grande Dame 1998 **Price dependent on market value**
Six years on lees, the 1996 Grande Dame is 'grande' indeed and much sought after. Traditionally voluptuous, the style is perfectly suited to the vintage. The blend is 65/35 in favour of Pinot Noir, the grapes being sourced from only the very best sites.

Louis Roederer Cristal 1993 **Price dependent on market value**
The jewel of the House of Louis Roederer is Cristal, created in 1876 for Tsar Alexander II. Cristal is made according to the strictest criteria, based on a drastic process of selection applying to the vintage, the cru, the village, the grapes and finally the wines. Only Pinot Noir and Chardonnay grapes from the House's 10 most celebrated crus are used in the production of this legendary cuvée.

Sparkling Wines

MM Masia l'Hereu, Mas de Monstol, Brut Cava Spain £18.20
Produced by Marqués de Monistrol one of the leading Cava houses having established winemaking at the property in San Sadurni d'Anoia in 1882, in the heart of Penedés. A blend of Macabeo, Xarello and Parellada grapes aged for a minimum of 30 months. Deliberately low acidity and slightly more toasted flavours than the classic brut.

Trevisiol Italy £19.20
Prosecco, Figli, Valdobbiadene, Vineto. The Trevisiol were one of the first Prosecco winemakers. Luigi and his son Paolo continue to make traditional sparkling wine from 25 hectares of prime Valdobbiadene vineyards close to the Alte-Adige border.

Cremant de Loire Brut France £20.70
Vibrant and racy fruit, bread yeast flavours and zesty apple freshness is accompanied by the waxed-lemon flavours of Chenin Blanc - a variety so clearly suited for sparkling production due to its fine acidity. The fifth of Chardonnay adds fruitiness and depth.

Bird in the Hand Australia £24.15
100% Pinot Noir. Estate grown and hand-picked. Salmon pink colour with a delicate strawberry aroma. The palate shows complexity with cherry and strawberry flavours and a creamy texture. The refined structure is highlighted by its subtle acidity and the elegance of very fine beading.
